Idaho Humane Society: Who We Are and How You Help

We are Idaho's leader in animal sheltering, preventing cruelty/neglect, and providing low-cost veterinary medical services and other safety net services for pets. Our lifesaving programs lead the way in innovation, impact, and effectiveness. The Idaho Humane Society is committed to meeting the varied needs of animals and the people who love them.

We're excited to take our mission to the next level at our new adoption center and veterinary medical hospital opening in Spring 2019.

We provide pets with veterinary medical care, food, shelter and most of all: **love**. But we can't do it without the generosity of our friends in the community – friends who know that when they donate to Idaho Humane Society, they are making extraordinary work possible. As an independent nonprofit organization (not affiliated with HSUS or ASPCA), philanthropy is crucial to our mission.

What does this giving support?

The cost of serving over **20,000 animals** last year – through sheltering and adoptions, community spay/neuter services, veterinary medical care for pets belonging to low income owners, Idaho's largest pet food bank, and more – was **\$14,000** per day.

Every companion animal we place in a loving home is spayed/neutered, vaccinated, microchipped, and provided the highest level of care while they are in our shelters – costing approximately **\$500** per dog or cat.

We have innovative programs, such as our correctional facility based program which annually places over **150** shelter dogs who need training or socialization with inmates who care for, obedience train, and prepare them for adoption.

Our Pet Food Pantry and Meals on Wheels program helped financially struggling families and homebound seniors by distributing over **70,000** pounds of pet food to them.

Over **3,000** children participate annually in our humane education curriculum where they learn about caring for animals and the environment, attend camp, and experience shelter tours.

We are honored to share the enclosed naming opportunities in the new facility, and discuss how you can partner in this lifesaving work.



Adoption and Humane Education Center

The new facility will have an adoption center designed in accordance with the latest knowledge of how to keep pets in shelters comfortable and healthy. Our animal friends will soon have more room to explore, roam, and play in noise-controlled housing with the latest ventilation technology and lots of natural light. Additionally, the Idaho Humane Society is currently the only provider of a formal humane education curriculum to children in the State of Idaho. Humane education programs help promote respect and compassion for living things and the environment and are an effective, inexpensive way of addressing significant social problems such as domestic violence and animal abuse.

Veterinary Medical Center

Providing quality veterinary care is a hallmark of Idaho Humane Society and is an essential component of our lifesaving work. Whether it is a basic vaccination, a spay/neuter surgery or complicated orthopedic surgery, our highly skilled veterinary team is there to assist animals in need. Also, through our partnership with Washington State University College of Veterinary Medicine, our hospital trains 48 senior veterinary students in surgery each year. The new Veterinary Medical Center will double our current capacity to provide care for animals.
